



#### Where It Started

Above is Knickerbocker Cottage at 426 Sixth Avenue in New York City where Shriners International founders surgeon Dr. Walter M. Fleming, actor William J. Florence, paper merchant William S. Patterson, lawyer Charles T. McClenachan, printer George W. Millar and others gathered practically daily in the early 1870's. Ideas for founding of Shrinedom were discussed at length here including Billy Florence's suggestion of an Arabic Theme. The Ancient Arabic Order of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine was officially formed on September 26, 1872 with Mecca Temple of New York City becoming the first temple within the organization.

# ANNOUNCING A NEW MEMBERSHIP REFERRAL PROGRAM



New Program has New Tools, New Focus, New Plans and Ambitious Goals

Shriners International has introduced the I AM R U program, a membership

recruitment program with a new focus, new tools and detailed plans which is meant to bring in 12,000 new creations by the 2018 Imperial Session. The overall success of this program depends on the commitment of individual Shriners to "Share Your Shrine" with friends, and on temples to meet/exceed their best number of creations in the last five years. If every noble and every temple does these things, the fraternity will be very close to achieving that goal of 12,000 new members. The new program will capitalize on the increasing awareness of Shriners International, and on new technology in WebFez that provides improved information regarding the progress and status of new member prospects, so that timely help and encouragement can be offered as they work through the process.

## USING TECHNOLOGY FOR MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT

The I AM R U program is a new approach to membership development that incorporates a referral program linked to WebFez that allows current nobles to directly refer names of friends, family members and acquaintances they feel would make good Shriners. The prospective member is linked with his referring noble, promoting natural mentorship based on an existing friendship or acquaintance. The new process can be tracked and reported, and each referral triggers automatic communications to the referring noble and the prospect. Once a noble makes a referral, he receives tools and resources to mentor his prospect and hopefully lead him to creation. The program encourages constant collaboration, so that every noble can share their fraternity with the good men around them.

## ATTRACTING INTEREST THROUGH WELL-PLANNED SOCIAL EVENTS

An important element of the new program is that it encourages temples to host fellowship parties and rush events to promote interest and attract membership prospects, and provides guidance that helps ensure success. For example, fellowship parties should be in a relaxed environment and have an open table/social concept, with no formalized membership presentation.

These events should be open to prospective members, without pressure for membership recruitment or restoration; and membership literature should be available upon request.

Rush events have an open house, social and educational aspects,

and are open to prospective members and their families. A multifaceted presentation providing information on Shriners International, including temple clubs and units, as well as information on Masonry and affiliated organizations is encouraged at these events.



Membership literature should also be provided to all attendees.

Our goal for each Imperial Year is less suspensions, less demits and more affiliations. The leadership of Shriners International has added the ambitious goal of 12,000 new creations from Session to Session. This goal is attainable if temples focus on matching and surpassing their own best number of creations in the last five years.

There are many resources available to help us reach our membership goals. Using the new WebFez referral system is the perfect place to start, and beashrinernow.com is still a great resource. There are also several helpful tools on Shriners Village, including the Membership Toolkit, Roadmap to Membership Success, and

Marketing Materials Ordering System. We encourage temples and nobles to work with their Regional Membership Director and the Office of Membership



Development, and to send your temple membership team to the annual Membership Seminar for invaluable tips and information.

In this happiest time of year some of the saddest news reaches my desk on a sometimes daily basis. As dues payments arrive with regularity, there are always some surprises within a few of the envelopes. The first thing that is evident is the lack of a check inside. I then see that there is hand-

writing on the dues notice or a piece of paper. The message usually starts with "Dear Sir" or "To Whom it May Concern". This is followed by the news that the Noble has mounted the black camel and has crossed that sublime desert to that house not made with hands. It may have been recently or even several months back. No matter, its heart wrenching to read the notice of another Noble lost to death. I then have to go into the WebFez system and make the notation referred to as Expired Active Member. Thus far, late in December of 2017, I have been notified of 37 of these cases, the same number received in 2016.

But is there nothing at all we can do about it? Well, we are losing about 40 Nobles per year. That means we need to add 40 New Nobles per year, or dare I say more than 40? Forget about the Nobles who refuse to pay their dues and get dropped after three years, that's another story. But what's wrong with trying our best to replace our dear departed Nobles? Absolutely nothing and its exactly what we need to be doing. Have you invited someone to become a Shriner this year? If not you should have. Please check out page 12 of this issue. There is a new program named "I AM R U". This allows you to go online and submit a name of someone you know that you think would make a good mason or Shriner. Shriners International will then take the lead and get information to that man. Maybe he will be interested, maybe not. But its a start. It's easy and may be effective. Try it today!



## A LOOK BACK INTO MAHI'S HISTORY



The first North South Football Game to raise money for Shriners Hospitals was held in December of 1946. It was a moderate success and Mahi leadership decided to do it again in 1947. What they did not realize is that the game would go on to become a major event cherished by thousands of Miamians. Christmas night was a time to unwind and the Orange Bowl was the perfect stadium for football. In the days before the Miami Dolphins and even the glory years of the University of Miami Hurricanes the huge venue hosted the Orange Bowl Classic on New Year's Day and high school football games. The easy access at the east end made it a breeze to get floats and vehicles inside for a pageant. As you can see above, Mahi put on a "Shrine" show prior to kickoff and then a Christmas pageant was held at halftime. The \$3.00 admission price would be about \$33 in 2017, so it wasn't as affordable as one might think. The game would continue until 1973 after 28 years of Christmas night entertainment.



Ten years after the New Year's Eve Bash referred to in the previous article, Mahi was still at it on the big night. Seen above on the last day of 1967 is the custom float commissioned by Mahi making its way along Biscayne Boulevard in the King Orange Jamboree Parade. The Mahi Divan and Hospital Committee would ride on the float along with a few of the local Shriners Hospitals for Children patients. The float was followed by the uniformed units of Mahi including all the different parade vehicles, marching bands and dignitaries. The parade was telecast with a local segment from 7:30 PM until 8 PM on WTVJ then the national feed would begin on CBS or NBC. From 1949 until 1974 Mahi was included in the national feed, but then on December 31, 1974, uninvited, the Director's Staff decided to get back in the lineup and pull up alongside the Orange Bowl Queen's float on national TV. This was (surprisingly) frowned upon by the committee and Mahi would remain on the local segment until the parades demise in 2001. The parade is still dearly missed by Miamians today.



It seems like New Year's Eve used to be a more significant event. In the days before people worried about drunk drivers and extensive television coverage at home, going out for the big night was a big deal. Most who were active in Mahi wanted to be a part of their legendary New Year's Eve Balls. Each December 31st the group would gather downtown to participate in the King Orange Jamboree Parade and then, in their finest garb, proceed over to the Bayfront Auditorium, Everglades Hotel or, after 1963, the Mahi Auditorium for the bash. An named orchestra would play until 1:00 AM and then breakfast would be served. Seen above is December 31, 1957.



Being community minded, Mahi supported the Salvation Army's Red Kettle Program throughout the late 1960's and early 1970's. This involved Nobles going out and ringing the bell at various location encouraging people to donate their loose change into the well known red kettles. The money collected helped feed the poor, especially on Christmas Day. Seen above are some of the December 1977 participants.

Alec lives in the suburbs of Chicago, and is quite the active teenager. From playing wheelchair softball and basketball, to assistant coaching tee-ball, he loves just about any sport. However, because he has Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI), also known as brittle bone disease, Alec's approach to his favorite activities is a little different.

OI is a genetic bone disorder characterized by fragile bones that can frequently and easily break, which can make it hard for Alec to participate in sports. The underlying cause of OI is a lack of collagen – or abnormal collagen – in the bones that prevents them from absorbing appropriate minerals and developing correctly. As a patient of the Chicago Shriners Hospital, Alec receives intravenous (IV) infusions of pamidronate, a medication that slows down the process of bone resorption and improves bone mass. He also routinely visits the hospital for physical therapy.

Thanks to the outstanding care and innovative treatment Alec receives at the Chicago Shriners Hospital, his muscles are strengthening and his bones are breaking less often. This provides Alec with more opportunities to indulge in his passion for sports. Alec often participates in up to four hours of sports a day; his mother, Alma, works hard to ensure his homework and physical therapy are done, as well.

They manage to fit it all in. Alec has been coming to the Chicago Shriners Hospital for treatment since 2002. Since then, he has made great progress thanks to his customized treatment with our rehabilitation specialists.

Alec's mom is grateful for the excellent care her son has received. "If there is a number system to rate the hospital from one to 10, I'd give it a 16," she said. "They are always working with him and pushing him to work hard."

Currently, Alec is building more strength and increasing muscle development through aquatic therapy. The hospital's therapists work with Alec in a temperature-controlled hydrotherapy pool using aquatic treadmills and other equipment. Tapping into Alec's love for sports, his therapist has even incorporated water basketball into rehabilitation sessions.

The hospital also helped provide Alec with a customized, adaptive bicycle. While riding the bike is fun, it also helps strengthen his muscles, to help prevent future bone fractures.

According to Alma, these unique treatments, specifically designed for Alec, have allowed him to gain more independence. He continues to work on increasing his mobility.



#### Shriners Hospitals for Children – Helping Dreams Become Reality

Thanks to the health care system's focus on improving the quality of life of patients and families, Alec has developed a level of confidence that has opened up a world of opportunities. Knowing that Alec hopes to be a sports broadcaster someday, the hospital staff has done what it can to encourage faith in that dream.

During the NFL Draft weeks in 2015 and 2016, patients of the Chicago Shriners Hospital had the chance to experience the excitement of the draft first-hand when players visited during a Prospect Community Visit. As a special surprise, Alec was given the opportunity to conduct interviews with NFL Draft prospects, which were featured on the NFL website.

Alec has also appeared in national commercials for Shriners Hospitals for Children, representing the many patients whose lives have been changed forever by the health care system. Alec is a great voice for Shriners Hospitals for Children, and continues to share his appreciation everywhere he goes.

"Without Shriners Hospitals for Children, I wouldn't be able to dream as big as I do," said Alec. "I know anything is possible because the staff remind me all the time that I can do whatever I set my mind to. I live a full life because of Shriners Hospitals."

# Free To Be Me The Stories of Isabella and Emily

Every year, Shriners Hospitals for Children® selects two National Patient Ambassadors to represent the health care system's patients. The ambassadors spend the year telling their stories of perseverance in the face of adversity and the ways Shriners Hospitals for Children has made a dramatic, life-changing difference in their lives. We would like to introduce our two new ambassadors:

#### Isabella Rose

From birth, Isabella had difficulty feeding and sleeping. Her parents, Roselyne and Tim, went from doctor to doctor seeking answers, but no one could identify a cause. As she grew, her parents became convinced that something was seriously wrong. Isabella's speech sounded like she was whistling and she had ear infections constantly.

#### **Searching for Answers**

For five years, Roselyne and Tim sought answers for their little girl but continued to be unable to obtain even a cause or a diagnosis. Some professionals thought Isabella was cognitively impaired; others thought she was deaf. One day a family friend in the Chicago area heard about the issues Isabella was facing and suggested the family apply for treatment for Isabella at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Chicago. The family did not know at the time that their friend's father was Dick Anderson, a member of Medinah Shriners and, at the time, Chairman of the Board of Governors of the Shriners Hospital in Chicago. Anderson was glad to be of help. He has said that helping Isabella and her family find the help they needed was lifechanging, and that he wished all the Shriners understood the impact they can have on the health care system's patients and families.

At their first appointment, an interdisciplinary team of professionals assessed Isabella and, within minutes, provided a diagnosis. Isabella had a submucous cleft palate, a form of cleft palate that is not easily identifiable, as the palate is covered by a thin membrane. "It felt like the whole world came down on us; we finally knew the diagnosis," said Roselyne. Isabella was scheduled for surgery to repair the cleft and subsequently received speech therapy for two years.

#### **Finding Her Own Voice**


Isabella, now 14, lives in Florida with her family. She has gone from struggling to be understood to becoming a gifted vocalist, and hopes to perform professionally one day. Isabella volunteers at a local veterinary hospital, pet sits and babysits. She enjoys painting, poetry and outdoor activities. She also actively seeks ways to give back to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

#### **Emily Mellish**

Emily's mother, Joy, did not experience significant issues during pregnancy, but moments after Emily was born, that changed. Emily was rushed by ambulance to a hospital in a larger city only hours after birth, and spent her first two weeks in the NICU, where doctors gave her a complete assessment.

Emily was born with spina bifida, as well as severe scoliosis (missing

eight ribs on her left side)



When she was 6 weeks old, Emily had surgery to close the defect over her spinal cord. The following day, a long list of serious complications began, keeping her in the hospital for 28 days. During this time, the Mellishes learned about Shriners Hospitals for Children from a close friend. "It was comforting to know that even before I needed to worry about a place to take her orthopaedically, that someone had come forward and said there was a place where Emily would be taken care of," said Joy.



Emily was first seen at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Erie when she was approximately 6 months old. There, she has undergone several surgeries. Other surgeries, including a VEPTR (Vertical Expandable Prosthetic Titanium Rib) procedure, which stabilizes the spinal curve and levels growth, were done through a collaboration between Shriners Hospitals for Children and Children's Hospitals of Pittsburgh. Emily has also been seen at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Philadelphia, where external fixators were used to straighten Emily's leg at the knee, and increase leg length.

After this, she was able to ride a bicycle for the very first time. Emily always amazes her doctors with her "no limits" attitude.

#### **Giving Back with Beads 4 Needs**

Today, Emily is an energetic and sociable 12-year-old. She loves dancing, swimming, painting pottery and public speaking. In 2012, she started Beads 4 Needs, an endeavor dedicated to raising funds for Shriners Hospitals for Children through bracelet and photograph print sales, and has raised more than \$100,000 for Shriners Hospitals for Children.

"Without Shriners Hospitals for Children Emily would not be Emily, she would be forced into a box," said Joy. "With Shriners Hospitals there are no limits to what she can do."





## Beauty Abounds at Miss Broward SC Contest







## Several Lodges May Move to New Locations







## KNOW THE NOBLE - WALLACE FINE

One of the most active Shrine Masons in Broward County is none other than Noble Wallace Fine. Wally, as he is known to his brethren, participates in most of the masonic activities in South Florida, including being an active Mahi Shriner.

Fine was born in Hollywood, Florida on March 20, 1943 to Bonner and Eveline Fine. His father was a dairy man and the family moved around a lot. He graduated from South Broward High School in 1961 and immediately went to work for Kwik Chek Markets (Winn Dixie) as a butcher. He was recognized for his abilities and worked his way up to 2nd Assistant Manager. In 1966 he enlisted in the United States Army where he learned structure air frame repair. He spent the bulk of his enlistment in Pleiku, Viet Nam. After being honorably discharged as an E-5 Sergeant, he returned to Miami and went to work for the legendary Eastern Airlines. He worked his way up through the ranks of mechanics earning his FAA Airframe Power Plant License. At the time of Eastern's demise in 1989 he was the Lead Mechanic in Acrylics and Glass. Forced to find work elsewhere, he joined Greenwich Air Services and became their lead Sheet Metal Mechanic through 1991.

Perhaps seeing the trouble ahead for Eastern, Fine decided to pursue a career in real estate and obtained his agents and brokers licenses in 1987. He soon went to work for Century 21 and became a top producer while still working full time at the

airline. By 1995 he chose to start his own firm and founded Fine Homes Realty Incorporated. The office specialized in the Pembroke Pines/South Broward area and continues to be a successful and well thought of firm with Wallace at the helm.

Fine became interested in Freemasonry in the early 1990's petitioning Roe Fulkerson Lodge No. 299 F. & A. M. in 1993. He was initiated, passed and raised all in that year. Becoming immediately active in the lodge,

he started his way up the chairs and served as Worshipful Master in 1998. After leaving the east he became Treasurer, a post he holds until this day.

Fine found it rewarding to serve outside the lodge and began branching out into other positions. He was appointed to the Grand Lodge of Florida's Property Committee in 2009 and has served as State Chairman since 2011. During this time he also served on the Zone 9 Child ID Committee. His hard work and dedication were recognized by Most Worshipful J. Dick Martinez, Grand Master of Florida Masons in 2010 who appointed Fine as District Deputy Grand Master of the then 33rd Masonic District. Since that time he has remained very active and was most recently appointed Junior Grand Steward for 2017 by Most Worshipful Richard G. Hoover bringing much honor to his lodge and district.



Fine became a Noble of Mahi and Shriners International in 1995. He was very active in the former Past Master's Unit and participated in most of the degrees and plays that the group put on for the various lodges in Mahi's jurisdiction. He joined the Valley of Miami Scottish Rite in 1995 as well and has been invested with the rank of Knight Commander Court of Honor and most recently as Inspector General Honorary 33° in November of this year.

Fine can be seen at almost any masonic function that is held in South Florida or the state for that matter. His dedication to the fraternity is unparalleled and he is one of the most respected masons around.

Fine has been married to Phyllis for 50 years. They have one daughter and two granddaughters. He enjoys spending time with family, gardening, artwork and reading.
